Epiphany: The Church Knows Where She's Going

"True Christmas joy, no matter how much or how little of it you may comprehend, means that you have Christ, and that you go where He wants you to go." – Kaj Munk, Danish pastor and martyr, 1898 - 1944

're in the midst of it. The Church Year. The journey from Bethlehem to Bethany, from the Manger to the Mount of Calvary, from the Child born unto us to the Son who will be given up for us.

This month we close out the Twelve Days of Christmas and enter into the season of Epiphany, and with this transition we delve even deeper into the meaning of our Lord's birth for us.

For the Christ child is born to die. We know this. The very rhythm of the Church Year clues us in to this all important fact.

The baby born in Bethlehem has come not simply to be adored in the safety of the stable, but to be lifted up on the suffering of the cross and so triumph over the death that we deserve.

This is the joy of the journey. Because Christ is born, there is peace for mankind. For because Christ is born, He is destined to die and rise again.

Perhaps one of the least known dates in the Church Year, is the Feast of St. Stephen, Deacon and Martyr, which falls on December 26th, the day after Christmas. As you might remember from the book of Acts, Stephen is the first martyr of the Church, who is stoned under the supervision of Saul of Tarsus in Acts 7:54-60.

The timing of this Feast Day may seem a bit strange. That is, to follow up the joy and exuberance of Christmas morning immediately with the first martyrdom of the Church. And yet, in reality, there is the closest of connections.

The joy that is begun in Christmas, is carried with the baptized throughout the Church Year and life of Christ and unto the feet Holy Week itself, where now, in

the Passion of Good Friday and the victory of Easter Sunday, that joy is perfectly and finally fulfilled.

Christ born for you means that death has lost its sting. It means that Stephen can die in peace because the war is already won. It means that the Christian that the Church, can know where she is going, because she is IN Christ, because she HAS Christ, and so follows where He leads: from birth to the font, from the font to the table, from the table to grave, and from the grave to the Father's Kingdom.

The Way is secure. It is finished. Therefore, as we prepare for another journey through Epiphany, Lent, Holy Week and Easter, be filled with the joy of the Church, that She knows where She is going, for She has Christ and follows where He leads.

Whether your baptismal journey leads you through earthly celebration or suffering, you have the peace to know where you are going, even if you don't see what tomorrow will bring. For in Christ, your tomorrow is in His care, and your eternity is already won.

LCC MEMBER SOLVES 64 YEAR OLD PROBLEM

Problem in Missile Guidance and Control: New Result Will Save Civilian Lives

ark F. Kruelle, a member of Lutheran Church of the Cross, has solved the missile miss distance problem, a long-standing problem in missile guidance and control. The missile miss distance problem determines the distance between a missile and its target which can either be stationary or maneuvering. An example of a stationary target is a fixed ground target, such as a building; an example of a maneuvering target is an enemy aircraft in flight. The time of flight of a missile from launch to target hit is known at launch time (although it must be continually adjusted in the case of a maneuvering target.)

Given the time of flight of a missile a crucial number related to navigation called the effective navigation ratio must be computed. In 1952 two engineers at Hughes Aircraft, R. R. Bennett and W. E. Mathews, published a technical memorandum in which they solved the missile miss distance problem for effective navigation ratios equal to the whole numbers: 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6.

Some 64 years later, in 2016, Mr. Kruelle solved the missile miss distance problem for both stationary and maneuvering targets for all values of the effective navigation ratio between 2 and 6 inclusive (the range for which the effective navigation ratio is meaningful). Given a particular time of flight for a missile, Mr. Kruelle has demonstrated how to compute the effective navigation ratio(s). There can be more than one effective navigation ratio in the range between 2 and 6 inclusive, and Mr. Kruelle has shown how to find optimal values for zero miss distance (i.e., the missile can be guaranteed to hit its target, except possibly in the case of an air-to-air missile, in which case the missile can be detonated within a "kill radius" that differs depending on the enemy aircraft).

Improved accuracy implies that a smaller warhead can be used to eliminate a target. The use of a smaller warhead in turn implies less collateral damage and fewer civilian casualties, if any, for a typical (i.e. non-nuclear) air-to-ground missile launch.

Mr. Kruelle's technical report entitled, "A New Formula for Miss Distance that Includes Noninteger Values of the Effective Navigation Ratio for Optimizing Zero Miss Distance," has been accepted for presentation and publication at the annual Sci-Tech Conference of the American Institute for Aeronautics and Astronautics in January of 2017. Mr. Kruelle's results are highly theoretical but nonetheless sound results that give great accuracy to a missile launch. However, further work needs to be done to confirm that the solutions are robust when uncertainties in physical measurements and sensor noise are introduced into the solution to the missile miss distance problem. Mr. Kruelle is currently at work addressing t h e s e issues.

Mr. Kruelle holds a B.S.E. in applied mathematics from Cornell and an M.Phil. in theoretical mathematics from Yale, where he was a Ph.D. candidate from 1986-1990 who completed all the requirements for the Ph.D. except the dissertation.

we return to school in January we hope to pick up from where we left off in December but realize it does take a bit of time to get back into the daily preschool routine. Yet students need structure and anticipate it and actually look forward to it, as do the teachers!

On Mondays in preschool we welcome the new week with a new letter. We take some time from our morning play to investigate what words start with that letter. Before lunch on Mondays we create a weekly placemat with that letter to use each day.

Monday afternoons following a quiet story time we do Monday math exercises to coordinate with the letter of the week.


On Tuesdays we talk about the lower case letter of the week and have Physical Education time and once a month we have Pizza Lunch on Tuesdays!

Three Chests






